

TIMROD PARK NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATION
MINUTES
MAY 3, 2011

1. Alicia Connelly, TPNA president, welcomed everyone to the meeting, which was held at the Jeffers Center.
2. The monthly police report was given by Scott Williamson of the CAT team. Overall, things were quiet. There were several car break ins reported this past month- Coit, Warley, Spruce, Cedar, Youpon, and Waters. Scott also reported that there was a burglary to a business on Coit as well as some stolen bikes. He said the police continue to monitor the situation at the boarding house on McQueen St. Again, it was mentioned that we should call if anything suspicious was seen. As there is an increased in foot traffic as the weather gets warmer, we were reminded to lock our vehicles and remove valuables.
3. The financial report was given by the Secretary-Treasurer. There is \$ 952.30 in the account. The minutes from the previous meeting were approved.
4. A number of issues were discussed:
 - A. TPNA fire hydrants are to be painted by the Boys Scouts. The city has agreed to provide the brushes and paint; Glynn Willis will work with coordinating the scouts. Alicia will see if she can arrange some PR- newspaper article, pictures, etc.
 - B. Heritage Hotel has been demolished. Alicia has emailed Glynn Willis about who will be responsible for hauling off the debris.
 - C. The City of Florence Zoning Advisory Committee and the Stormwater Advisory Committee are consolidating and there is a slot available for someone from Timrod Park. Alicia asked if anyone would be interested in serving. A couple of people expressed an interest and would talk with her after the meeting for more information.
 - D. Timrod Park improvements were discussed.
 - E. There was a discussion of neighborhood stickers [from last meeting]. Steve Guyton is working with someone on a prototype. Input was solicited and cost was discussed. Ideally, the design could be used in some type of real estate brochure to "advertise" Timrod Park. Hopefully there can be some finalization by next meeting. In addition, Steve Powers will be giving us an estimate for new meeting signs.
 - F. There was discussion about whether we as a neighborhood wanted to focus more on enforcement of current ordinances or whether we wanted to explore developing new ones specific for the neighborhood. The consensus seemed to be "better enforcement." Complaints were compiled and telephone numbers to call were distributed. We were all encouraged to call.
5. Election of officers for the year was held. The new officers are Alicia Connelly, President; Teresa Simons, Vice President; and Winfield Brown, Secretary/Treasurer.
6. Meeting was adjourned with the next meeting scheduled for June 7, 2011 at 7PM at the Jeffers Center.
